

## Primary PE and Sport Grant

### Midsomer Norton Primary School – 2016/2017

The government is providing additional funding of £150million per annum to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools. Each school receives £8000 plus an extra £5 per pupil. Midsomer Norton Primary School therefore receives £9275 towards sport for the academic year 2016/2017.

#### **Investing the Grant**

Our school is using the funding to:

- 1) Pay for a specialist sports teacher, for 6 hours per week, whose role is to:
  - Develop a whole-school sports curriculum with the school's PE co-ordinator;
  - Provide in-class professional development for school staff;
  - Run PE sessions with each class once a week;
  - Run extra-curricular sports clubs;
  - Lead the coaching of some of our Year 6 children to become 'Sports Leaders'.
  - **COST: £6950**
  
- 2) Pay the membership costs for MSN & District Primary Games Association partnership allowing us to:
  - Enter Level 2/3 competitions and tournaments throughout the academic year;
  - Receive CPD sessions for staff from a range of leading experts;
  - Send our PE subject co-ordinator to Subject Leader Meetings to improve the PE provision in our school;
  - Be given a range of sport coaches to lead PE sessions within school.
  - **COST: £45**
  
- 3) Release time for PE coordinator to attend training
  - **COST: £350**
  
- 4) Maintain and upgrade school sports equipment and kit;
  - **COST: £580**
  
- 5) Pay transport costs to enable teachers to take groups of children to a wide variety of tournaments and festivals throughout the academic year;
  - **COST: £330**
  
- 6) Purchase of playground games to promote active play
  - **COST: £553**
  
- 7) Release time for teachers to attend sporting events.
  - **COST: £1043**
  
- 8) 6) Subsidise the cost of extra-curricular clubs led by outside agencies;
  - **COST: £200**

## Impact of the Grant

The impact of our investment of the sports funding on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment includes:

- 1) Being awarded 'GOLD' in the Sainsbury's School Games Mark for high quality PE provision for the second year in succession in 2015/2016.
- 2) Maintaining the high level of participation of tournaments and competitions throughout the academic year, from a wide range of children;
- 3) A vast and maintained improvement in performances and results in tournaments and competitions, including:
  - 1st in the ESFA Football Somerset County Finals 2016 (4th in 2015);
  - 1st in the MSN Association Sportshall Athletics competition at Norton Hill 2015 & 2016 (qualifying for the county finals at UWE – finished 3rd in the county both years).
  - 1st in the MSN Association Quadkids Competition at St Benedict's (qualifying for the country finals at Bath University – finished 3rd in the county).
  - Other victories include: rounders, netball & cross-country.
- 4) A more consistent amount of physical education each child receives in school (2 independent sessions per week);
- 5) An investment in outdoor equipment for use at play and lunchtimes, resulting in more physically active children during these times;
- 6) A more knowledgeable and skilled PE co-ordinator to monitor the standards of PE provision in school;
- 7) A rise in the participation in extra-curricular sports clubs after, and during, school hours;
